- The entrance to the church, added in the late 1100s.
- NAVE
  Where the lay brothers worshipped until the 1400s.
- 3 AISLE CHAPELS
  Small chapels, often burial places.
- 4 MONKS' CHOIR
  Where the monks sat during services.
- TRANSEPTS
  The 'arms' of this cross-shaped church.
- The holiest part of the church, containing the high altar.
- 7 SACRISTY A store for vestments and vessels.
- The monks' meeting room.
  Look for the memorial to
  Robert the Bruce, whose
  heart is buried at the
  abbey.
- LATRINEThe abbey toilets.
- 10 CLOISTER
  A central garth or square.

- 11 WASH PLACE
  Where monks washed their hands.
- NOVICES' DAY ROOM
  Where novice monks could work.
- WARMING ROOM
  Where monks could warm
  themselves.
- 14 REFECTORY
  The dining hall

- 16 LAY BROTHERS' RANGE
  Where the labour force of the
  Cistercians lived and worked.
- 17 MAIN DRAIN
  - Abbey museum, in what was the Commendator's house.
- 19 ABBOT'S HALL Probably built in 1246.

- MILL-LADE
  Diverted from the River Tweed to power the abbey's industry.
